

## Baptism Testimony-Lori Oehlhof

I don't remember a time I didn't have Jesus in my heart. I accepted Christ as my savior at very young age. I am grateful for the foundation that was laid during my childhood, but didn't really understand what it meant to have a daily walk with Jesus and to truly make these beliefs my own until I was an adult. God was calling me to look to him for the answers and put our faith in him and not myself. God has given us Jackson for a special reason, and I believe it was to make me completely trust him throughout his entire leg lengthening process. It is when we are on our knees in despair, that we can completely see the glory of our healing savior. Even though we had a few extra hiccups in the road, God always provided everything we needed. And as we left the UW Hospital late last fall, Ryan said "Here's to no more hiccups in the road" Jackson responded, "Dad, What's wrong with hiccups, everyone has hiccups?" And he's right, everyone has hiccups and it was because we had the loving protection of our Savior's salvation walking along side us, we could celebrate the journey.
