We arrive safe & sound in the DR, with luggage! No small deal. Thirteen of us are from High Point Church; representing Crossroads Church are Pastor Doug & Vicki, their 6th year in a row.

Decked out in orange shirts for our travel day, this helps start many conversations with strangers, in which we get to share our mission and the message of Christ. We pray to likewise befriend and connect the gospel with many Dominicans this week in our adopted barrio of El Almirante.

Welcoming us to the DR are four locals who head up this Hands of Hope (HoH) operation in 2016—(*L to R*) Alex, Marino, Almonte, and Richard.

This represents a transition in HoH leadership from last year; also new in their role as trip leaders are Doug Ready (*above, front & center*) and Brennen Weber (*inset*), both 3rd year DR veterans from High Point.

The Acuarium Hotel—luxurious by local standards, with A/C and a pool—



serves as our "second home" for the week. In

water volleyball (at left), the object is to beat the heat, not each other. We yearn for streams of (cool) living water to flow as freely as the fun and frolic during our break time.

We are hungry, but food can wait this first day. So can packing the 100's of pounds of rice & beans, cooking oil, salami and other staples—which each sponsored child's family will


receive, beginning Monday. That's tons of food for our 57 sponsored kids, who each get home visits, many this week. Kids—and influencing them for Jesus—that's what this mission trip is all about.

This week we also deliver 212 books to replenish the community library that Casey Zynda and our mission partners initiated just last year. These books are mostly donated by the Spanish language class at the Verona (WI) High School. Also among the donations to this fledgling library are one desktop and two laptop computers.

Three days of Vacation Bible School (VBS) are again in the works, to nurture 100's of kids toward faith in Jesus. Six Bible studies in Joshua (a new program for us in 2016) are planned for the many teens (at right) who typically hang around the younger kids.

Also new this year is a physical therapy program, with 17 hurting folks already signed-up for Marisa Gordon & Codi Halbur to visit. Marisa and Codi will be teaching others, as well, to carry on the good work and touch people in Jesus' name.

Despite a forecast of daily rain showers, we begin building at least one large house this week, fit for a homeless family of seven who lost theirs in a fire last year.



Can't wait to see what happens in answer to your prayers, as God unveils the hope and a future He has for the good folks here in the Dominican Republic.
